Dear Parents and Carers,

The autumn leaves have been blowing through the doors this week which has meant that our cleaning staff have been in additional action with the vacuum cleaners at a day's end. Also, the change in temperatures can bring the onset of autumnal bugs, of which two have been harassing us at school: upset tummies and general colds. We do feel that, in many cases, it is best to be in school if possible, but with dodgy stomach bugs the "48 hour rule" must apply.



Today sees a large demonstration in London by headteachers from across England. Schools are facing rising costs, including the challenge of accessing support services for our pupils which we now need to pay for at higher rates; rates not unlike commercial prices. We are needing to do at least the same amount for our pupils but with fewer pounds. Naturally, there is no bottomless pit! Walkwood has managed it's finances carefully, using money we wanted to spend on the school, such as carpets and furniture, from our 'piggy bank'. Those reserves will be gone at the end of this academic year. We have been so poorly funded in the past that the increase that the national funding formula would have brought are too much! Consequently, the sum of £100,000 that we would have expected is held back for at least this year.

More money may be being put into education, as the government states, but independent evidence is tending to suggest that, in real terms per pupil, this is not the case.

I am grateful to our MP, Rachel Maclean, who has been making the case for Walkwood to Department for Education and other colleagues. She was also in school yesterday to take questions from some of our Year 8 pupils, who certainly put her on the spot.

Within this issue you will also find information about the shoe box programme that we shall be looking for support with through our Harvest Appeal. He has not left himself without a witness in doing good - giving you rains from heaven and fruitful seasons, and filling you with food and your hearts with joy. Acts 14: 17



Year 5 'Settling in' Evening

We would like to offer you the opportunity to come into school with your child on Thursday 25th October between 4pm and 7pm to meet primarily with their tutor. This will provide you with the chance to see how they have generally settled into Walkwood during the first half term.



On the same evening, if you have a pressing concern you would like to discuss with English, Maths or Science teachers, these subject teachers will be available if required. Please however bear in mind that some staff members have more than one Year 5 group and a tutor group, and so they will not be able to meet with all parents of the pupils they teach. Therefore, please book in with your child's tutor teacher as a priority and then the core subject teachers only if you have any immediate concerns. This is not our formal parents' evening, this will come later on during the academic year; you will also receive a full school report in February.

As explained in your welcome pack we will be using Epraise for parents' evening bookings. There is an app available for Android and Apple phones or you can visit <u>www.epraise.co.uk</u>, ensuring you select Walkwood Church of England Middle School from the list of schools.

If you have forgotten your password, or have never logged into Epraise before, then click on the parent tab and enter your email address, leave the password field blank, press submit and a password will be sent to your email.

If you do not have an email address registered with us then you will be unable to login so you will need to contact the school reception to add an email address to your contact details.

Once in Epraise select Community then Parents' evenings. Click on Year 5 Settling In Evening, then book appointments with the required staff. If booking more than one appointment I would suggest leaving at least five minutes between appointments to allow yourself time to travel around the school. Do not forget to bring your appointment schedule with you to parents' evening. Room lists, so you know where to locate staff, will be available on the evening.

Ski Trip 2020

Zauchensee, Salzberger Sportwelt, Austria



Following the success of this year's ski trip the school is planning a ski trip to Austria in 2020 and we would like to offer your child the opportunity to participate in this trip.

We are planning on returning to Zauchensee Ski Resort in Salzberger Sportwelt, Austria, travelling by executive coach and aeroplane departing on Saturday 8th February 2020 and returning on Saturday 15th February.

The Zauchensee Ski Resort is located within Austria's largest ski area, the Salzberger Sportwelt. With a combined piste of 345km and being a very snow sure resort, the Salzberger Sportwelt is an excellent resort for school groups.

Our accommodation in Zauchensee is a modern four star-premium hotel in the heart of the resort. Pupils will certainly be able to maximise their time on the slopes due to the outstanding location of the hotel, which is within a 200m walking distance to the ski lifts and nursery slopes. The hotel includes its own in house ski hire, TV/DVD Room, a recreation/games room with a football, table tennis, air hockey and pool table. Rooms are very comfortable, all en-suite, sleeping up to eight students with balconies overlooking the picturesque views of the surrounding slopes and mountains.

The cost of the trip is £1290 which includes:

Return flights and resort transfers

Coach transfer between school and airport

- 7 nights' accommodation on a Full Board Basis, including a hot two course lunch in the hotel
- 3 hot meals a day, including a 3-course dinner in the evening.
- 6-day lift-pass for all ski resorts in the Salzberger Sportwelt.
- 6-day hire of skis, boots, helmets and poles.
- 6 days of 4-hour ski tuition with qualified instructors at a ratio of 1:10 pupils.
- A range of evening/après-ski activities such as swimming, bowling, games night and quiz.
- Fully comprehensive travel insurance, which includes 24-hour medical assistance, ski loss or breakage, personal money and loss of travel documents.

The deadline for receipt of the first deposit is:

Friday 12th October 2018 - £150 representing a <u>non-refundable</u> deposit.

Information about further instalments will be issued upon offer of a place. The preferred method of payment is by Parent pay. A link to this is available via the Walkwood School Website.

If you are interested in your child taking part in this trip and they did not come home with a letter, then please ask them to come and see me for one.

Having been to this resort with Walkwood Church of England Middle School pupils on two previous ski trips, I am confident that the arrangements will give the students a tremendous week of skiing and a great experience in the Austrian mountains.


