

## Ability Sets in Year 5 English

So far this term, Year 5 pupils have been taught in mixed ability sets. Now that they have completed their first half-term with us, we are in a position to organise them into ability sets, to help maximise their progress in English lessons. Therefore, from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> October, the year group will be split into two halves and organised into two parallel set 1s; two parallel set 2s; two parallel set 3s and one set 4. Set 1 will accommodate the highest achieving pupils, and so on.

If you have any pressing issues related to English and have, therefore, booked an appointment to see an English teacher on the Open Evening (Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> November), you will of course be booked in to see the teacher who has taught your child since the start of September. He/she will pass on to the new English teacher any information arising from the parents' meeting appointment.

This year the Readathon will run from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November – Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November. It will be a celebration of reading for pleasure, with pupils striving to read and quiz on their library books with particular gusto during this week. The top reader in each college (measured by the number of words read) will win a prize of a £10 book voucher.

In addition, the Readathon will also be a celebration of reading poetry for pleasure; every child in the school will be given the task of learning a poem off by heart, to perform in an English lesson during the week of the Readathon. This is a light-hearted, fun celebration of poetry – both classic and contemporary, and is a celebration which we know the pupils will love to be a part of.

To support the pupils with choosing their poem, we have collated two collections of poetry - one of KS2 appropriate poetry and one of KS3 poetry - a mix of contemporary, classic, sad, humorous, lengthy and brief, with inclusion of a wide variety of poetry, from sonnets to haikus. There is a poem in there which each pupil in the school, regardless of ability, will be able to access and enjoy!

These collections of poetry will be uploaded to Epraise by your pupil's English teacher in the near future and pupils will be given two English homeworks to help them with the task of learning their poem by heart. Your child could simply choose a Haiku if they wanted, or if he/she wanted more of a challenge, they might opt for a Shakespearian sonnet; indeed your child is welcome to choose any appropriate poem of their choice outside of the suggested Poetry Packs, if they so desire.

English teachers will then choose an English lesson during the week of the Readathon for the poetry sharing. This might be organised as a poetry 'slam' type lesson, others might share sitting as a circle; others might organise pupils to work together to deliver a choral presentation of their poem.

Year 5 – please note that year 5 pupils will be organised into ability sets after half term, and so their launch of the poetry task will wait until then. They will be given longer to learn their poem and so they may not perform them during the actual week of the Readathon.

We know that our pupils will embrace the Readathon with enthusiasm. Should you have any questions, please contact your child's English teacher.

We are hosting a children's Book Fair from Scholastics.


The Book Fair will be open in the School Library from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November until Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November.

## Clarification on hair styles

Thank you to all those parents/carers who get in touch with support or suggestions. These help us to improve both the academic and life experiences that your child receives while they are at our school. You can be assured we are constantly reviewing all aspects of our school to ensure your child receives the best possible education.


In support of this, the school has a number of policies which set out the levels and standards we expect for attendance, uniform, behaviour and homework. Copies of these are available on our website, [www.walkwoodms.worcs.sch.uk/](http://www.walkwoodms.worcs.sch.uk/). In depth uniform guidance is also outlined in the pupil planners as well as on the website.

The majority of our pupils respect and follow these policies. However, in recent weeks we have noticed that a small number of pupils are attending school with hairstyles which we do not consider appropriate within the policy, which makes us mention that we do not allow extremes of hairstyles in school. To avoid any confusion, all hairstyles need to adhere to the following guidelines:

- No parting lines, patterns or tramlines should be shaved into the hair or eyebrows.
- Hair should not be shaved shorter than a grade 2.
- No undercuts.
- Colouring is only allowed if it appears natural.
- Hair bands must be plain and only blue, black or grey in colour (no other hair accessories should be worn).
- Hair extensions are not permitted.

Please note that should a Walkwood pupil be found not to be adhering to the above, it may be that they are withdrawn from their normal timetable whilst parents are contacted and the issue rectified. In some cases it may be necessary to send a pupil home to make the necessary adjustments, before returning to their learning. The school's decision in all matters is final.

The half term break will at least allow these 'fashion' haircuts to grow out before we return to school. As ever, we would welcome your support in this matter.





## Year 5 Settling In Evening

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you about the upcoming parents' evening that you received a letter about at the start of October. This evening is on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> November from 4.00-7.00pm and is primarily an opportunity to meet with your child's tutor. This will provide you with the chance to see how your child has generally settled into Walkwood during the first half-term.

On the same evening, if you have a pressing concern which you would like to discuss with English, Maths or Science teachers, these subject teachers will be available if required. Please, however, bear in mind that some staff members have two Year 5 groups and a tutor group, and so they will not be able to meet with all parents of the pupils they teach. Therefore, please book in with your child's tutor teacher as a priority and then the core subject teachers only if you have any immediate concerns. This is not our formal parents' evening; this will come later on during the academic year. You will also receive a full school report in February.

If you do not have internet access you can phone reception who will be able to book appointments on your behalf.

# Sports News

What a fantastic term for football at here at Walkwood! It started with the Year 6 boys defending their district title at Woodfield. As the tournament went on, the team grew in confidence and faced St Bede's in the semi final. Walkwood had the better of the game but needed extra time to overcome a battling Bede's performance. They went on to win 3-1 after extra time. The lads took this result into the final and swept aside Ridgeway 3-0 in a domineering performance. The lads went on to win and claim their second district title!

Then came the Year 7 boys team who were also going for back-to-back district wins! Again, Walkwood started slowly in the group stages, but battled through as group winners and faced Woodfield in the semi-finals. The lads started this game in impressive style and went 2-0 up inside the first 3 minutes. They stepped off slightly and gave away a sloppy penalty. The resulting penalty was saved by Matty Hitchens in impressive style and the lads went on to win the game 3-0. Onto the final and it was St Bede's that stood in the way. Again Walkwood had the better of the chances throughout the game, but St Bede's continued to hold out. Extra time flew by and penalties loomed. Each team scored their first three penalties meaning sudden death had to decide it. Walkwood scored and Bede's missed meaning that Walkwood took the title for a second year running!

It was then the turn of the Year 5s at their district tournament last Thursday. The team were buzzing with enthusiasm and this was evident with their first performances. Walkwood started very well, beating Birchensale 2-0 and then Woodfield 3-0. In the final group game, Walkwood narrowly lost to Ipsley. However, they still progressed through to the semi final against Ridgeway. Walkwood dominated the game and took a 1-0 lead, but Ridgeway continued to battle hard and equalised, taking the game into extra time. Again Walkwood dictated the play and their pressure resulted in a second and winning goal setting up a final against Ipsley. The final was highly competitive with both teams giving it their all. Unfortunately for Walkwood, Ipsley won the game 2-0 with two excellent goals. Nevertheless, the team should be very proud of finishing runners up and producing such a high standard of football. No doubt our Year 5s will go on to enjoy lots of success on the football pitch over the coming years.

After amazing success in the boys' football, came the chance for the girls teams to impress. The Year 7s went to their districts and battled well but found the competition tough, and with injuries and bad luck on their side failed to make it through the group stages, but they can be proud of their battling performances. The Year 5s definitely put all of their excitement of representing Walkwood for the first time into this tournament. Their enthusiasm to play was infectious, and although some have not known each other for long they worked as a team throughout.

As each game went on, the team went from strength to strength, improving their style of play and scoring some great team goals. We had won all of our games, and our last game was against St Bede's. The girls were determined to not let the winning streak slip and they did not disappoint, beating them 4-0! Winning all of our games and not conceding a single goal, it's safe to say the girls did us proud! Well done girls! Fantastic first appearance for Walkwood!


