Dear Parents and Carers,

As you read this, about half of Year 6 will have left Redditch and will be heading for Yorkshire, where we expect to arrive mid-afternoon. Those who have remained at school will have had a day off-timetable with some additional physical activity. The other year groups have been very accepting of the changes that SATs require of us for this week, although I suspect Year 8 would have preferred not to have to do their exams!

There are details inside of the arrangements for Sports day, which will be weather dependant. Please take note of the access to the field and the lunch requirements for pupils as we shall not have a canteen providing hot food. We shall check the long range weather forecast when we publish The Insider next week.

Last Friday, while we were sending out The Insider, interviews for the post of Bredon College Leader were on-going. This vacancy has arisen as Mr Walsh will leave at the end of the academic year to take up a teaching position in the United Arab Emirates. After a very full day of activities for the candidates, with pupils having a voice through two different panels, the decision was to offer the job to our internal candidate, Mr Hunt. He shall become College Leader in September, and his tutor group will be taken over by another teacher - more details of the pastoral arrangements for the new academic year will be shared in the weeks to come.



Walkwood's Year 6 Boys football team reached the English Schools F.A. 7-aside National Finals after winning the Midlands Finals event in Nottingham on Saturday. The school qualified after winning the Worcestershire Finals and were grouped with schools representing Lincolnshire. Northamptonshire, Wolverhampton and Birmingham. Walkwood went through to face Whitchurch (Shropshire) and after a 1-0 win, they reached the final against West Bridgford (Nottingham). A 1-1 draw led to a penalty shootout with Walkwood coming out on top. Walkwood will now go to the English Schools F.A. National Finals at the Ricoh Arena in Coventry as part of the final 8 schools in the country.

Mr Sanders is incredibly proud of the boys' efforts and the boys had to pull together as we had four players away on a cricket tour. The boys keep finding ways to win and there is a great team spirit within the group. The finals will be another level of challenge for them having won all 7 and 9-a-side tournaments since they started in Year 5 last year.

With Sports Day 2018 looming, I am writing with a few details of the day. Our Sports Day's emphasis really is on College allegiance as well as whole school participation. The whole school will be down on the field for the majority of the day. Cold snacks and drinks will be available to purchase on the field during morning break time and ice creams/lollies at lunch so pupils will need to bring in money if they wish to buy anything. Please ensure your child/children have a large bottle of water (1L) and a snack.

Lunchtime will take place on the field, therefore, please provide your child/children with a packed lunch. (For children who receive Free School Meals, a packed lunch will be provided.)

Parents are invited to join us; there will be a spectators area in which you must remain during the events, however there will be an opportunity for you to eat lunch with your child during the specified time. Parents and families are more than welcome to bring their own seating or blankets.

Access to the field will be via the entrance on Swinbourne Road only after 9.30am. There will be no access through Walkwood reception or Vaynor First School.

As every child is expected to take part in an event, may I take this opportunity to ask you to make sure that your child/children are in the correct kit: black shorts, white polo shirt, blue or white socks and trainers. Rugby tops and black tracksuit bottoms may be worn whilst waiting for their event. Pupils are to come to school in their school PE kit only – there will be no negotiation on kit, if it is not correct, they will not participate and have alternative work to do. If you have any problems/queries please contact school before the day.



Please also ensure that your child is equipped for our varying weather i.e. waterproof jacket, hat and sun cream and bring any medication with them. Please note, we are not allowed to give out or apply sun cream.

Every child is expected to take part in at least one event. They will be representing and gaining points for their college in doing so.

Parental and family support in previous years has been brilliant and I hope you will join us this year to acknowledge and celebrate the talented and committed children we have here at Walkwood. Please note that the order of events is an estimation and we may run slightly ahead or behind schedule. So please take this into consideration, to avoid the disappointment of potentially missing your child's event.

Pupils will not be able to leave after their event has finished, they will return back to tutor to be dismissed at 3.30pm.

We are aware that some parents will wish to take pictures of their children, can we ask that pictures are only of your child and that they are not put on social media, this helps us to ensure safeguarding of our pupils.
