A report has been published about outcomes in the three tier system. Here is a flavour of the content:  
*“Students in three tier schools achieve above the average for all state funded schools in England. Critics of middle schools systems have in the past sought to portray the three tier system of schooling as somehow inherently flawed and unable to deliver good outcomes for pupils. Analysis of recent GCSE data shows that the opposite is the case.”*



The report goes on to mention the advantages that middle schools can offer, and also when two transfer points within children’s education can be beneficial. I have mentioned before that Walkwood has a broad curriculum for our pupils, and other examples are given too. Pupil well-being is a source of positivity too. You may not be aware that other countries use middle schools, including the USA, with Australia being a country that has taken up the idea, albeit with a slightly different age range to our own. 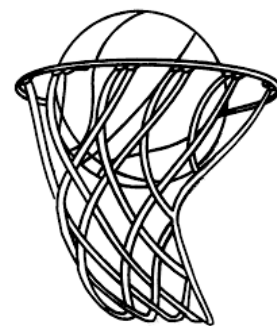

On Tuesday 13th February the Walkwood Year 6 Boys travelled to South Bromsgrove High School to compete against the winners of each of the Worcestershire Districts. Having won the Redditch District tournament in October, Walkwood would face games against Hagley, Kempsey, St Barnabus and Aston Fields. The team worked incredibly hard and a last gasp equaliser against Hagley from Zach Bishop secured what turned out to be a vital point. In freezing conditions the boys went on to beat Kempsey and a strong St Barnabus team thanks to goals from Owen Rae, whilst the defence remained solid to only concede one game throughout the whole competition. The boys only needed a draw against Aston Fields to secure the top spot in the league and started on the front foot playing some eye-catching one touch football. We came close to taking the lead through shots from both Arran Richmond and Jackson Preece but the score remained 0-0 at half-time. The second half became a lot tighter and Aston Fields were denied a winner on two occasions thanks to great saves from Matty Hitchens.

There was a tense wait after the final whistle to confirm that we had sealed the win, but after final checks it was confirmed that Walkwood were U11 Danone Cup Worcestershire Champions. The boys celebrated along with Mr Sanders and this was another addition to their impressive trophy haul since joining Walkwood. In Year 5, the boys were District Champions and they defended their title again earlier this year. The boys are also still in with a chance of winning the Worcestershire 9-a-side County Cup with an upcoming home semi-final against Witton Middle School to come. The boys remain undefeated in open football (both 7 and 9-a-side) and it a credit to their

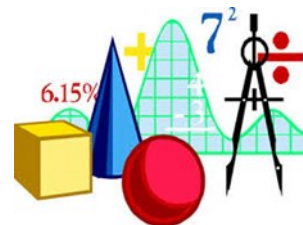

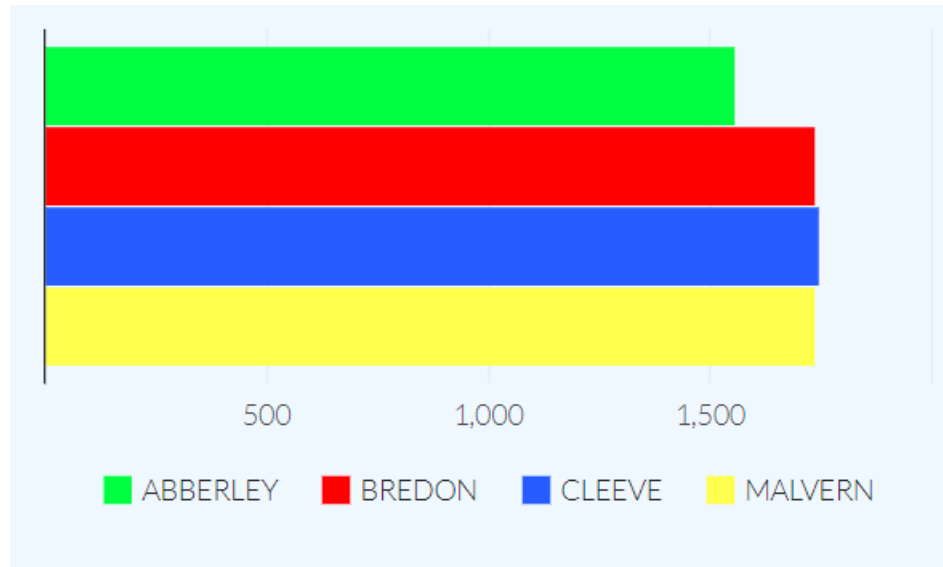
