## **Appointment of Teacher of Humanities and Spiritual & Social Education (Teachers' Main Scale)**

The post holder will be responsible for planning and delivering high quality lessons (both departments have detailed schemes of work) and engaging pupils with activities that challenge and excite. The successful candidate will demonstrate consistently high standards of teaching and excellent classroom management, drawing on the positive behaviour of our pupils.
