Yesterday was World Book Day and we marked the event with some literacy activities. One was 'Pass the Book' where chapters from a particular text were read as part of each lesson through the day. These were:

Year 5 – Coraline by Neil Gaiman

Year 6 – Artemis Fowl by Eoin Colfer

Year 7 – Refugee Boy by Benjamin Zephaniah

Year 8 – Welcome to Nowhere by Elizabeth Laird.

This process supports our daily Drop Everything And Read (DEAR), which allows pupils and staff to connect with reading for pleasure, even if reading is a challenge (and for those of us who are dyslexic, it can be so without resilience). Additionally for World Book Day, all our staff had a label on their lanyards which had the title of a book on it. The challenge for pupils was to collect as many book titles and the associated staff names by the end of the day.





Tickets are now on sale for Bugsy Malone, being sold at lunchtime by Mrs Cull. The seating on the night will not be numbered, but we will be asking that there are no gaps when you sit down for the no longer performances. Refreshments will be available in the interval.

You will all be aware of the high-profile outbreak and spread of coronavirus. The information is updated almost daily, and we review our actions. The current summary states: No school should close in response to a suspected (or confirmed) COVID-19 case unless advised to do so by Public Health England. Personal hygiene is the most important way we can tackle COVID-19, and a lot has been said about washing hands carefully—a poster (see inside) is next to the wash-hand basins in school. Last week we contained a reminder of the "catch it, bin it, kill it" strategy for those with coughs and sneezes. An informed, considered and measured approach will be key on this, as with other matters.






The 6 Steps of Hand Washing
