Online Safety for Parents & Carers



Walkwood is a certified school with National Online Safety, from whom our regular cartoon-like updates are obtained. This organisation is now offering two free courses, one each for pupils in years 5 and 6, with a second for the older two years. The courses provide you with the knowledge and skills you need to feel confident and empowered to keep your children safe online.



Children aged between 7 and 11 start to become more aware of the possibilities of the internet and begin to make decisions about what they'd like to do online which is usually either influenced by their peers or by their interests. As they start to become more independent, and start to access different things, it's essential parents take an active interest in their children's safety online.

Children aged between 11 and 14 are usually confident in their online abilities; technology is integral to their life and they often know what content they like to consume and how. Social media, gaming online and messaging apps become more popular, which means greater opportunities to communicate with others, so it's important to take an active interest in your child's online safety



Learning Outcomes

- ✓ Understanding the online world today and striking a balance between promoting the positive use of the internet and safeguarding children from harm.
- ✓ Recognising how children at this age are interacting with the online world, the technology they're using and what games and platforms are most popular.
- ✓ Identifying the common risks that children at this age are most vulnerable to and the range of online harms to be aware of.
- ✓ Understanding what steps to take to support a culture of online safety at home and help build children's digital resilience.
- Recognising the importance of communicating with children at all times, keeping an open dialogue and providing children with the tools they need to keep themselves safe.

✓ During their time at the school, pupils develop into confident, articulate pupils. They acquire good social skills, develop tolerance of others and are resilient.



Statement: Sam is feeling exhilarated this morning.






