Dear Parents and Carers,



This week's theme has been in preparation for Remembrance Day on Monday, and Mrs Johnson lead assemblies as a reminder too. Our school will mark the Act of Remembrance at 11am on 11th November. Some writing by our pupils, facilitated by the author who visited before half term, is included inside. The Picture of the Week pays tribute to the women of World War Two, who were much overlooked until the building of the second cenotaph in London, which is shown within the picture.

At The Vaynor First School this morning, I joined Year 4 as they laid poppies around the tree, with our Head Boy, Joe, and Head Girl, Lexie, taking part. I was impressed by the commitment of the children from our neighbouring school, and expressed my thanks to them through their Headteacher, Mrs Dunstan.

We held information evenings on Wednesday of this week to cover Renaissance Reading, Year 6 SATs and also for the Key Stage 3 Curriculum. It is right and appropriate that reading has once more come to the fore as an issue in school, but for us it never went away. The impact of regular reading at an appropriate level is now conclusive in links to higher GCSE results. As a dyslexic person, I know only too well the challenges that reading regularly can bring (with which my Mother would agree!). Regarding SATs, the position we have taken in the past will continue, that is we will not 'drill' the pupils for their tests, but prepare them thoughtfully and supportively. The feedback from the sessions was very positive

indeed, and the resources are available on the website should you wish to follow up.

Finally, some of the PE classes this week have been doing gymnastics in the Hall, which is accompanied by music. I am amazed at how the youngsters are able to sing along and carry out their activity too!


Picture of the Week






There are 17 individual sets of clothing and uniforms around the sides, symbolising the many different jobs women undertook in World War II.

The Physics of Forces



with Dr Jenny Watson of the Ogden Trust, at St Bedes Middle School, Holloway Lane, making physics matter Redditch, B98 7HA. This will take place on <u>Wednesday 13th November</u> from 6pm to 7pm.

The evening is aimed at Y6-8 pupils and their families. The intention of the evening is to engage them in Physics in a fun and accessible way. We would ask that at least one adult accompanies a maximum of two children.

The night will consist of an interactive 30-minute talk full of demonstrations, followed by the chance to try a number of activities yourself, including sitting on a hoverboard, making a CD hovercraft (please bring a 'Fruit shoot' bottle top if you want to keep it), balancing a helium balloon in mid-air, making a ping-pong ball hover etc.


