Public health update

As you know from earlier updates, a small number of COVID-19 cases have been identified at our school.

To date, no confirmed cases of the Omicron variant have been confirmed at the school.

Additionally, all cases and relevant contacts of the small number of COVID-19 cases within the school are currently self-isolating and we are continuing are communication with Worcestershire County Council and the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA). Within school, our control measures minimise transmission and ensure a safe environment for our pupils and staff.

If your child has symptoms of COVID-19, you should arrange for them to take a PCR test as soon as possible, and notify the school of the result. Your child should continue to self-isolate while waiting for the results of a PCR test.

From the Department for Education:

"School attendance is mandatory for all pupils of compulsory school age and it is a priority to ensure that as many children as possible regularly attend school."

"Children and young people aged under 18 years 6 months who usually attend school and have been identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19 who is not a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant, should continue to attend school as normal."
