Did you know that research has found that the strongest factor affecting pupils' science scores is reading comprehension (EEF, 2017)?

Please remember our expectation for our students to read daily for between 20 and 30 minutes. Some of that reading will need to be done outside of school. Pupils will benefit from reading aloud daily to an adult (even if for a short time), right the way up to year 8 and is not just an exercise useful to younger children.
