


A number of Walkwood students entered the poetry competition held by Severn Arts a few weeks ago.

You can do anything so give it a go.



## SATs week 2025

Firstly, we would like to say how proud we are of the effort being made by our Year 6 children as they prepare for SATs and we would like to thank you for the support that you are giving your child.

The timetable for SATs week is as follows:

Monday 12<sup>th</sup> May: English Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar – Paper 1 and Paper 2

Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> May: English Reading.

Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> May: Maths Paper 1 (Arithmetic) and Maths Paper 2 (Reasoning)

Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> May: Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning)

It is vital that children attend school daily during SATs week. Should children arrive late or miss days, in accordance with the rules they will be isolated from their peers until they have completed their papers in order to avoid prior exposure to the content of the test papers. Please contact reception in the usual way should your child not be well enough to attend school. Someone from school will then contact you by phone.

To enable the children to come into school and feel relaxed we are offering breakfast club each morning from 8:30-8:45 am in the movement area. The children will be able to come into school and enjoy toast and juice with their peers. There will be no cost for this to parents but the closing date for signing up for this was 9am on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> April to allow us time to purchase the required amount of food.

It is vitally important that pupils have a good night's sleep and arrive at school on time each day. In order to further support your child with their assessments we ask that you ensure they have the following equipment- pens (no rub out pens are allowed), pencils, ruler and a protractor. Please help them to be organised by checking their equipment the night before. No smart watches are to be worn in tests so please ensure your child is not wearing one.

If you have any queries regarding SATs week then please do not hesitate to contact your child's maths or English teacher.

Finally, we just want to wish the pupil's good luck. Whatever your child's results we know that they have tried their hardest and that we have incredibly talented, kind, passionate and resilient pupils that we are extremely proud of.
