

KS2 English Workshop



Just a reminder that on Monday 21st January 2019 from 6:30-7:30pm, we will be holding a KS2 English Workshop for parents and carers. The focus of the evening will be the English curriculum in Years 5 and 6, with a particular focus on the expectations of grammatical knowledge in these year groups.

The introduction of the new curriculum in 2014 meant changes to the grammatical knowledge that pupils are expected to have, and also the specific reading skills needed to access the reading paper at the end of KS2. At the English Workshop, we will discuss some of these expectations; it will also be an ideal opportunity for you to ask questions and talk to staff.

Please note that this workshop is intended for parents/carers and should not be attended by pupils. We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued role in helping you child with their English subject knowledge and understanding. Grammatical knowledge and reading skills are key components of the curriculum and we value the support that you give. We look forward to seeing many of you on 21st January.


