As the debate continues nationally about the most appropriate course of action to reduce the infections from the coronavirus, we have continued our preparations in case they are needed. Where individual families may be isolating, we are able to provide work that is matched to our in-school curriculum. We provide the range of subjects that are being covered in school. Unless you told us otherwise in the recent survey, any home learning will be uploaded on to ePraise.

That same facility will also be used for Parents' Evenings. The first will be a brief virtual 'touch base' with the tutor, and we have that scheduled for Thursday 12th November. You will receive more details about how arrangements will work, but you will need access to ePraise (see inside for how to do that).

We continue to be vigilant with our cleaning, and require pupils to wear masks when they are in places where social distancing is not possible (unless, of course, you have let us know about a pupil being exempt). A report this week did point to the increase in positive cases in the 10-18 year old age bracket (which may have been skewed by older teenagers). However, we have younger pupils on site and they need protecting too.

This week is when we would have held our Open Evening, an event that many of you would have attended in the past and which affected the decision of some of you to send pupils to Walkwood. It will be of no surprise that it cannot happen in 2020, nor that the alternative is virtual. 
# gruelling

#### Track and trace

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:


- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.
