Walkwood

This term we are firmly in the mindset of 'back to normal' as we cast off the remaining vestiges of Covid measures. Consequently, pupils now register in their college tutor groups, this having <<< BACK TO NEW NORMAL been a key feature of our schools high quality pastoral care. Assemblies have restarted in the formats that exist, including those for individual colleges as well as whole school. The changing rooms are back in use to allow pupils to be able to dispense with their PE kit and return to school uniform after physical education—this is preferable for reasons of hygiene, especially in summer.

If we have extended periods of warm weather this term, we shall temporarily suspend the compulsory wearing of school jumpers. However, such decisions are made by members of the senior leadership team, as stated in our uniform policy, and it is not the choice of individual pupils. If children are warm in a classroom, they may ask the teacher if they may remove their jumper, but as they move to the next lesson, pupils must be wearing it again. This significantly reduces the chance of a pupil losing a piece of uniform—it is hard to misplace a garment if it is being worn! Equally, to avoid a jumper being dropped unawares, pupils are not permitted to wear them around their waists. Such measures are informed by years of experience!

SHAKESO Year 8 have had the joy of the Young Shakespeare Company this morning. The actors talked through YSC 🖁 key scenes from Romeo and Juliet to demonstrate what the words of the playwright meant. They ap-COMPANY plied humour to the task, and used some pupils to 'assist'. It was a most enjoyable hour an a half.

Year 6 will have their SATs in the week of 9th May, while Year 8 will do their high school tests at the same time. There will be some timetable amendments both next week and the following one. Remember that we do not believe in 'stressing out' pupils because of SATs, but do want them to feel fully prepared. This is a tactic that has worked so well in years past, and so we return to normal once more.



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


