Dear Parents and Carers,

As a matter of course, we praise pupils for their achievements. The ePraise app allows you and pupils to keep a track of how many points they gain throughout a day. Each lesson allows a pupil to be awarded an ePraise point from the teacher if progress in learning has been made. There are additional points to be awarded for other reasons, and these are listed within the app too.



During half term, our Assistant Principal, Mr West, was in the USA where he was inducted into the Hall of Fame at his former university, the University of Ashland. This is because he was a very successful and proficient footballer (or in the US, 'soccer player') alongside his

academic work. He lead the university soccer team to three successive and significant wins and remains the person who amassed the most career points. 



#### Homework 2022-23

The new homework timetable has been introduced this week, please see below. As you can see, the timetable covers Maths and English for Key Stage 2 and Maths, English, French and Science in Key Stage 3. The tasks set may take a variety of forms, including computer based and paper based.

Homework will be recorded on ePraise, which can be accessed at home via your child's account or your own parental account. On completion of homework, we ask the pupils mark tasks as 'done' on their ePraise accounts (via class notes). If the homework requires an 'upload' of work to ePraise, the act of doing this will mark the task as having been completed. For each homework that is completed on time, your child will receive one ePraise point and your child's teacher will acknowledge it 'complete' via ePraise. In some cases, your child may be directed to other websites such as Mymaths to complete a task but these will still be marked 'complete' on ePraise.

When homework has not been completed or is completed after the due date, your child will receive a demerit. If homework is not being completed on a regular basis you will be contacted by your child's subject teacher and/or tutor to discuss ways to help your child complete their homework.

Honour is one of our school values—our Fruits of Faith. Our definition is: We show respect to others and know that all people are God's creation.



Amigo is a social platform which purports to connect strangers from around the world and, with built-in translation software, it reduces the expected language barriers. Focusing heavily on one-to-one chat, video calls and live streams, Amigo encourages its users to build up online relationships and unlock exclusive features such as private video and audio calls: essentially, the more that people chat, the more functions become available to them. This is an app designed with mature users very much in mind and is therefore definitely not recommended for children.




